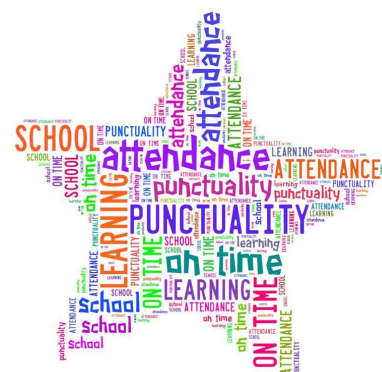

100 DAYS OF PREP

Last week was a big week for our Preps who celebrated their 100 days of school. This is a big milestone for our Preps, and a marvellous celebration of their first year at school. The learning and development that has occurred in the first 100 days of school is astounding and tribute to the students, teachers and families for their ongoing efforts and commitment to learning.

LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

We have continued to have a high number of students arriving late for school. This means that students have arrived after the 9:00am school bell. The playground is supervised from 8:45am and we strongly suggest that students arrive at this time to play, run around with their friends and socialise.

At 8:55am, music commences over the loudspeakers and this is an invitation to the students to enter the classroom and prepare for the school day.

Formal teaching commences at 9:00am and all students are required to be in class and ready to learn by this time.

If your child is late by only 5– 10 minutes they are missing out on explicit teaching time. At this time of day most classes will be undertaking explicit teaching of spelling or reading. This is vital to literacy development. Children who miss this time will not receive this essential instruction and this will have a significant impact on their learning.

2024 PARENT, CAREGIVER AND GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY

The survey is conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

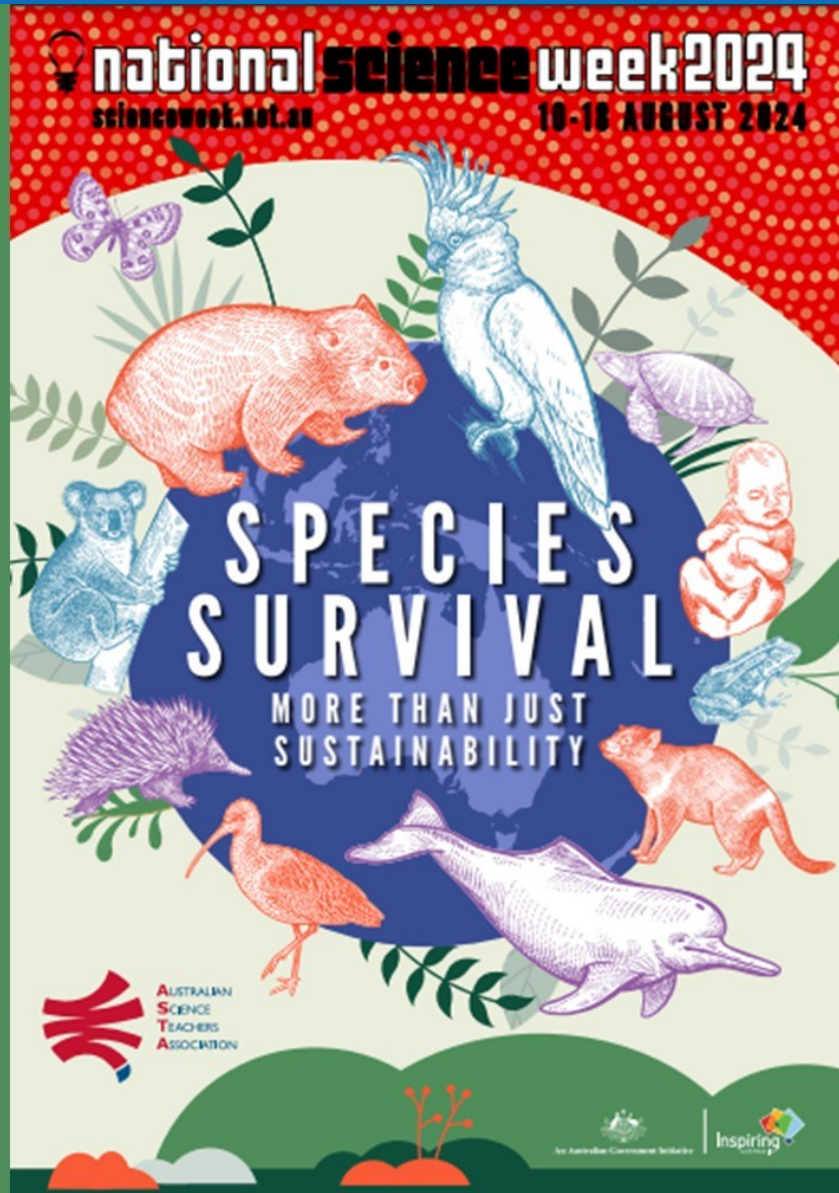

We ask students to be more careful in their play, but this does not mean that accidents won't happen, so if families could pop a spare pair of pants into your child's bag it would help. This would be very important if you know your child is often coming home in muddy clothes.

Emma Mickle!

Last Friday, students from Grade 3 to Grade 6 had a wonderful incursion from a special visitor, Emma Mickle. Emma is a 30 year old woman who has overcome one of the biggest obstacles in her life and is now an Australian paralympian.

At 27 years old, Emma was a paramedic. She loved going for runs, triathlons and was living a normal life until...

In January 2020, Emma was invited to New Zealand to hike the Kepler Track. At the last minute she decided that she would go. Emma was hiking with her friends for five days and then, on the fifth day she sat down on a rock to have a rest. Out of nowhere, a three metre branch fell from 20 metres! Both the friends that sat on the rock on either side of Emma were completely fine. But, it landed straight on top of her. Little did she know, her life would be changed forever.

After waking up in hospital 3 days later, Emma discovered she had broken 20 bones and 3 vertebrae. Because of the impact, she suffered memory loss and kept saying the same thing over and over, something that she and her friends can laugh about now. But that was only the beginning of Emma's long recovery. Over many years, she underwent many surgeries. Emma was gladly one of the 1% that would be able to walk after the spinal cord injury! Emma had to do 3 months of learning how to walk again!

Emma broke her skull, jaw, clavicle, humerus, six ribs, wrist, hand and ankle and one of her vertebrae completely popped! She had 7 surgeries on her right arm alone. After her accident, Emma wasn't able to go to work and wasn't strong enough to go for runs and that was when our old friend Covid was happening, so she decided to watch the Paralympic cycling event to pass time! When she was watching, she saw an athlete win gold who had the same disability as her!

The next day Emma decided to go for a bike ride. She fell over so much because she couldn't feel half of her body, so it didn't hurt! Emma got this three wheeled bike which she thought was dorky! But it was super useful and then she thought that it wasn't that dorky and then she decided to ride from her house in Cockatoo, Victoria all the way to Canberra which was 1000 km! She then got back on the 2 wheeled bike!

Emma then decided to try a proper race! Guess how well she did? She finished 15 minutes behind the rest! Then she did it again and she finished 8 seconds behind the gold medalist!

Today, Emma is on her bike 20 hours a week, spends 3 hours in the gym and 2 hours at the physio. She eats 6 meals a day (2 breakfast, 2 lunches, 1 snack and 1 dinner) She has a strict bedtime of 9:00 pm and is up everyday at 5:00 am!

Emma mickle is an amazing athlete and is going to try to make the paralympics in Paris this year!

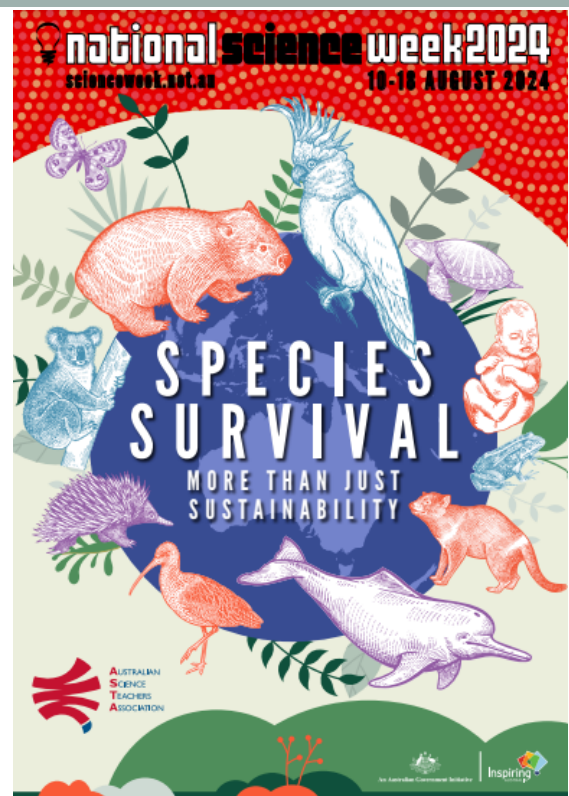
We wish Emma all the very best and will be cheering her on all the way from The Basin!

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open, and The Basin Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved.
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2024.

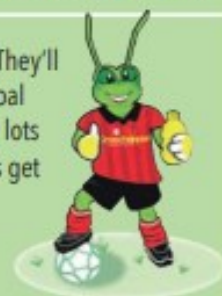

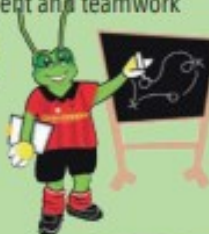
