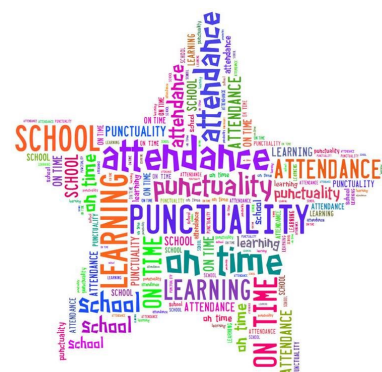

Aspiring Leaders Conference 2024

On June 4th the School Captains went to Heathmont Secondary College to participate in The Aspiring Leaders Conference with 54 other leaders from other schools in the Maroondah Council area. This session was run by the Year 11 and 12 students from the college and Maroondah City Council.

One of the first activities we participated in was exploring what a good leader does and what a bad leader does. We took giant pieces of paper and we brainstormed together with students from other schools.

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open, and The Basin Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved.
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2024.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

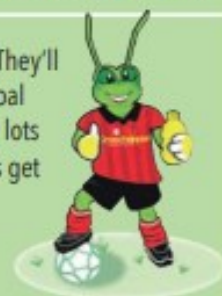
