
Our students have been busy working hard in their classrooms and every day there is a real buzz when you enter each and every classroom. To support this learning our students have been to the Legoland, Cook's Cottage/Polly Woodside, Chesterfield Farm and our annual Snow Trip. Our Breakfast Club has run each Friday, our Preps have had a Mother's Day Breakfast and we have celebrated Education Week. Our Grade 6 students attended a three day camp to Phillip Island and our Grade 5s a three day camp at Cave Hill Creek.

We have participated in House Cross Country, District and Regional Cross Country, District and Regional Swimming. Student leaders have lead and organised a weekly leadership program and Grade 5 students have created fantastic bonds with their Prep buddies. I would like to thank our parent community for your input into the school. Every day we have an army of parents who help out around the school. From reading in classrooms with our students, attending sporting events, participating in school committees or attending camps. ## HOLIDAY WORKS

We are very excited to have a number of projects occurring at the school over the holiday period. We have new paths from the carpark being formed which will double the width of the existing paths as well as a set of steps being constructed which will connect the pathways from the portables to the main carpark. This will prevent students needing to navigate the dirt slope, which can be treacherous in the wet winter months and connect our pathways. Our annual tree works will be undertaken to ensure our healthy trees are maintained.

Most importantly, in the second week of the holidays we will have the installation of the playground which the PFA have been fundraising for over the past couple of years being installed. The funds raised from the Colour Run (\$30,000) in March this year got us to the \$70,000 that the new playground costs and we are most excited that the installation will take place over the school holidays and be ready for the students to use upon return to school next term. Thank you to everyone from the PFA and all our school families for your support in raising the funds for this upgrade.

This year all schools in the Outer East are using an online system for new enrolments to Victorian government schools called VicStudents. 


# Prep CBL Expo!

## Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open, and The Basin Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved.
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2024.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

# The Great Book Swap


