PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Last week we held a very moving ceremony to mark ANZAC Day. A big thank you to all students involved in organising and implementing this and to the respectful way students responded.

During our Curriculum Day last Friday, the staff completed their CPR update and undertook a Professional Development session on the teaching of reading. Staff are focussing on reading this term as an updated English curriculum is being introduced in Victoria.

In response to the introduction of this curriculum, we are changing our reporting format. This has involved staff input and consultation with many parents in the community. The reports have been approved by the School Council and all feedback we have received has been extremely positive. The new format involves the curriculum Achievement Standards and Future Learning Goals for Reading and Viewing, Writing, Speaking and Listening and Mathematics. The other significant change that you will notice is that classroom teachers will be reporting on the Play Is The Way concepts in place of Effort and Behaviour. As you will see, these concepts cover effort and behaviour in a far more informative way.

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YEAR 6-7 TRANSITION

Starting secondary school is one of the biggest steps in your child's life. As there are a variety of options for your child's secondary education, choose a school to suit your child's needs. You may want to make a list of things that are important to you and your child or visit the schools you are interested in; they welcome enquiries and will organise a time to visit.

An important step is to involve your child in deciding which secondary school they will attend. The following questions may assist you as you consider which secondary school will best benefit your child:

- Will the school cater for your child's needs and interests?
- How does the school support children with additional needs?
- How important is it that your child knows other children at the school?
- Does your family have a connection to a particular school?
- Do you have older children already attending a secondary school?

ANZAC ceremony for the KNOX SCHOOLS

On the 19th of April, 42 Grade 6 students attended the Rotary Club of Boronia ANZAC ceremony for Knox Primary schools at the Time Neville Arboretum.

We attended the Arboretum at 11 o'clock. It was the largest group of students gathered - there were over 600 students from 10 schools.

We were welcomed by members of the community, and sung the national anthem along with primary schools singing. St Joseph's Primary School choir among others sung ceremonial songs.

We listened to a speech by Captain Kylie McDonald. She was in the navy and one of the experiences she had was boarding an illegal fishing boat where she had to translate and it was a very scary time.

Captain Kylie McDonald also talked about the HMAS Sydney, who on the November 19th 1941 was cruising in the Indian Ocean when a German ship got in their way and a naval battle began. Battling for their lives, it ended when the two ships sank. It took 67 years to find the HMAS Sydney; it was one of Australia's biggest naval battles.

After Kylie spoke, we had more choir songs, wreath laying, the Last Post played by St Joseph's College Year 10 students, one minute of silence and The Ode read by retired navy vet Marie Everette.


