PARENT CONTRIBUTIONS 2024

You will notice on your Newsfeed under Course Confirmation that the 2025 Parent Payments are now available to be paid on Compass. A big thank you to those families who have already paid.

This year as we endeavour to keep the cost of schooling down as well as cut down on excess books we are changing our book packs. Parents are no longer required to collect a book pack from the office. CLASS PLACEMENT FORMS FOR 2025

As we move towards the end of the 2024 school year staff have been working on the process of creating grades for the 2025 school year. Whilst this sounds like a straightforward task, creating grades is a complex process which takes much time and effort.

What factors are considered when making grades?

The objective of making classes is to ensure they are as balanced as possible. Factors that teachers and principal staff consider are learning needs, behaviour, gender, learning and social networks, social and emotional maturity, class placements in previous years, opportunity for students to broaden their friendship groups and family situations (eg. twins, cousins, siblings).

Why has my child not been placed with one of their four nominated friends?

All children are placed with at least one of their four nominated friends. While this question is often asked, when the handwritten forms of the students are checked it proves that a mistake was not made. Quite often students forget who they selected or inform their parents they have not been placed with at least one friend when in fact they have.

Why haven't my requests been approved?

All family requests are seriously considered and recorded. At times, family requests can be conflicting with another family's request, to the student's requests, or from the professional opinion of the teacher.

When I get my child's class placement, can I request that it be changed?

The class placements are considered final. Changes are not made due to the fact they cause a chain reaction and impact on the class balance. We consider the learning and wellbeing of each individual during the placement process and families must realise their child is part of a complex equation in school placements. If the school has made an obvious error, a change may be made.

How can I help my child during this process?

Families can help by supporting the informed decisions of the staff and ensuring all conversations with their children are positive and encouraging. Hold a conversation with your child and discuss who would be suitable to list as 5 possible classmates in 2025.

PARENT AND CARER SCHOOL SAVING BONUS CODE DISTRIBUTION

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus – a one-off \$400 support for government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

From Tuesday 26 November 2024, you will receive an email from the Department of Education with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code.

The School Saving Bonus will help families cover the cost of uniforms, textbooks, excursions, activities and more.

If you have multiple children enrolled in Victorian government schools for 2025, you will receive one School Saving Bonus code email per child. These emails might arrive on different days. Please make sure to check your spam/junk email folder.

Parents and carers can use the School Saving Bonus code in store at school-nominated suppliers. Parents and carers can also choose to access the School Saving Bonus online system, where they can allocate part or all the \$400 bonus to use at school nominated-online suppliers or for school activities. ADULTS APPROACHING STUDENTS

A reminder to all parents that we strongly encourage you to speak to class teachers when an issue or concern arises that relates directly to something that has happened in the classroom/playground. Unfortunately in the past few weeks we have had a number of instances where parents have approached students to discuss concerns. **Parents must never address an issue with another child, nor approach the parents/carers of the other child/ren.** Students being confronted by an adult other than a staff member is quite distressing. The matter must be dealt with in the first instance, through the class teacher and where required, leadership.

Sometimes, what has happened or been said in the classroom/playground is taken out of context or is exaggerated; or both sides of the issue are not presented. When such matters are discussed widely, or when passing information from one party to another, the facts can often be distorted and inaccurate. If an incident occurs at school and has been dealt with at school, it should be left as a school issue and should not be discussed outside of the group of people it directly involves.

Parents are welcome to discuss an incident with the class teacher who has dealt with it for further information or clarification. However, I reiterate, due to confidentiality, the matter should not be discussed with other parents in the school community. Parents may sometimes not agree with the way a staff member deals with a classroom / playground incident between two or more children. Staff manage situations often based on the best information they have possession of at the time. At The Basin PS we are working with students to action solutions to issues which arise around learning, friendships and disputes, and I think parents would agree this is a lifelong skill which requires building strategies and unconditional support.

I encourage communication and a great deal of patience and understanding with our approach to managing issues. I can't emphasise enough the importance of good parent—teacher communication — it is much easier to solve problems, feel reassured and be confident in what is happening in the classroom when there are open channels of

Australian Wildlife Lecture with Andrew Wegener

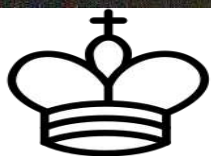

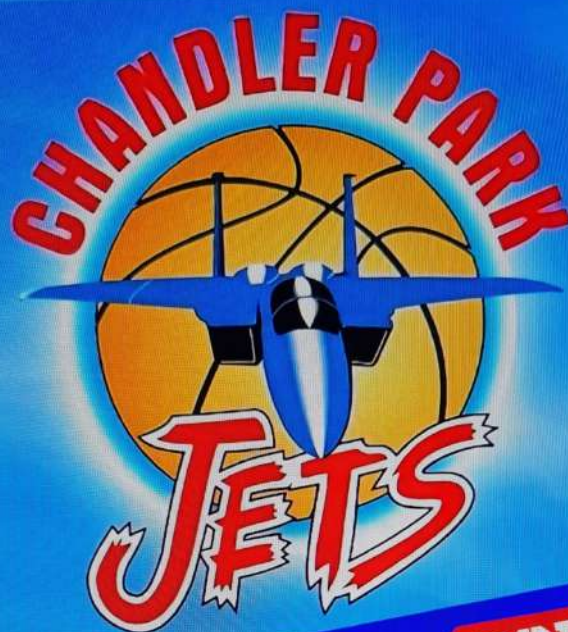
