### WORLD TEACHERS DAY

## PARENTAL CURRICULUM CONTRIBUTIONS FOR 2025

At this week's school council meeting we agreed not to increase the amount we request for voluntary parental contributions for 2025. This is the second year in a row we have opted to maintain this amount rather than increase it. Whilst we get government funding for a standard curriculum, this only provides for basic standard of materials, resources and equipment for our students. ### Women in STEM Incursion

On Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October, we were lucky to have a visit from 3 industry scientists, Rachel, Madhu and Herath, from Thermo Fisher Scientific as part of their 'Women in STEM' program. The purpose of this program is to provide support to girls who are interested in Science by providing them with information and options about potential future careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) areas. As part of this program, 22 of our Grade 5 girls took part in an experiment where we extracted the DNA from strawberries.

Students were guided through all of the steps in this protocol, learning about role of detergent in cell rupture to release DNA from their crushed strawberries. Students then were able to see clumps of DNA that they had purified and learned that they had isolated the DNA from the rest of the cells.

This was an incredibly unique experience for our students to participate in some higher-level Science. It was inspiring to hear from these amazing scientists as they reinforced the message that girls should follow their interests and explore new opportunities.
