## NAPLAN 2024 Wednesday 13 - Monday 18

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years $3,5,7$ and 9 . It has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in mid-March (previously May).
NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- reading
- writing
- language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- numeracy.

At The Basin Primary School, we take great pride and care in ensuring that our students are not overwhelmed by the suite of assessments that are comprised in the NAPLAN schedule. Whilst NAPLAN tests are an important system -level component of the Department of Education, at The Basin Primary School they are viewed as just another form of assessment in our ongoing process of monitoring student achievement.

To alleviate any pressure or anxiety associated with the tests, a special timetable has been formulated to assist teachers and students in the implementation of the tests. The timetable provides ample time both before and after testing for students to prepare and relax. In addition, students will also have an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the types of questions, layout and expected timeframes within which they are required to work for each of the test domains.

We are confident that our well-considered preparatory procedures will enable your children to complete the NAPLAN assessment suite with minimal concern. For more information about NAPLAN please click on the link: https://www.nap.edu.au/

All government schools are required to administer tests starting Wednesday March 13 and will be completed by Wednesday March 20. We will publish the schedule to Grade 3 and 5 parents closer to the testing dates.

## WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)

We encourage and value parental and community support at The Basin Primary School. There are many ways that parents, grandparents and friends can assist at our school. We encourage all parents to obtain a Working with Children's Check that will allow you to be very involved in your child's education. These checks are free for volunteers and will allow you to be involved as many school events as you require. Once you have your WWCC, please come to the office so we can photocopy this and we will add your name to our list of parents who have a current WWCC check.

## EVERY MINUTE AND EVERY DAY COUNTS

At The Basin Primary School we are committed to providing your child with an excellent education. The building blocks of a great education begin with all students coming to school each and every day. Regular school attendance is vital and missing school days can have a big impact on your child's future - missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. From Prep to Year 12 that adds up to 1.5 years of school!


5 days off per year is approximately a day off every 8 weeks

10 days off per year is approximately a day off every 4 weeks

15 days off per year is approximately a day off every $21 / 2$ weeks

20 days off per year is approximately a day off every 2 weeks

Just 5 days off per year adds up to 7 weeks of missed schooling throughout your child's time at Primary School.

10 days off per year adds up to 14 weeks of missed school-
$=$ ing throughout your child's time at Primary School which is about a term and a half of school.

15 days off per year adds up to 21 weeks of missed school-
$=$ ing throughout your child's time at Primary School which is about two terms of school.

20 days off per year adds up to 28 weeks of missed school-
$=$ ing throughout your child's time at Primary School which is almost three terms of school.

Just as important as regular attendance is punctuality. Our music plays at 8:55am and this year we open our soors to the classrooms at this time with the aim that students will be in class, organised and ready for their school day to start at 9:00am. If you are finding that you are regularly late, please take the time to look at the morning routines and see if there is something which can be changed to help you get your child to school on time each day. As well as the missed learning time, your child being late also impacts the other students in the class as teachers time is taken up re-introducing the learning tasks and means that your child is playing catch up from the time they enter the room. If the school can be of any assistance please feel free to
make a time to see me to discuss the issue.

## 5 minutes late every day = 3 days of school lost a year

10 minutes late every day = 6.5 days of school lost a year
Being late to school can have a considerable impact over the whole school year.
The table shows you just how much time can be missed through a year by being just a little it late every day.

15 minutes late every day = 10 days of school lost a year

20 minutes late every day = 13 days of school lost a year

## 30 minutes late every day = 19 days of school lost a year
