

This week, our school participated in **Bullying No Way!** Week, a national initiative that recognises the importance of taking action against bullying.

Throughout the week, students engaged in classroom discussions and activities that explored this year's key themes:

Be Bold, Be Kind, and Speak Up.

These conversations
encouraged students to reflect
on what bullying looks like, how
it affects others, and, most
importantly, what they can do
to create a safe and
supportive environment for
everyone.

By working together and embracing kindness, we continue to build a school community where everyone feels respected, valued, and included.

WHAT IS BULLYING?

Bullying is when someone **repeatedly** and **intentionally** hurts another person—physically, verbally, socially, or online, It often happens when there is a **power imbalance**, such as greater strength, social influence, or access to information.

- Physical: hitting, pushing, or damaging belongings
- Verbal: name-calling, threats, or hurtful teasing
- Social: excluding others or spreading rumours
- Online: using technology to embarrass, threaten, or harass

Bullying is **not** just a disagreement or a one-off mean comment—it's ongoing behaviour that impacts a person's wellbeing and sense of belonging.

At our school, we work together to promote kindness, respect, and speaking up to keep our community safe for everyone.

Be Bold: You have the power to help Be Kind: Small actions make a big impact Speak Up: Speak up against bullying

TIPS FOR FAMILIES

- Talk openly with your child about their day and their friendships.
- Model kindness in ever yday interactions children notice how adults treat others.
- Encourage speaking up when they see unfair behaviour, even if it's small.
- Reassure them it's always okay to ask for help from a trusted adult.



ART

After diving deep into the reef, we'll shift our focus to our First Nations Art unit, exploring the powerful tradition of storytelling through Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art. Students will learn the cultural significance behind these stories and create meaningful artworks inspired by them. It's shaping up to be a bright and inspiring term in the art room!





PERFORMING ARTS

We are learning Drama!

Our youngest students will explore drama h play and imagination. They'll use their , bodies, and emotions to act out aracters and tell short stories in fun games and activities.

Grade 1 & 2: Students will enjoy lots of drama games and activities. They'll create and share small performances with their classmates and start to learn how people in different cultures enjoy and perform drama.

Grade 3 & 4: Students will begin creating and performing their own drama pieces for an audience. They'll explore how drama is made and performed in different times, places, and cultures.

Grade 5 & 6: Students will focus on improvisation, script work, and performing for an audience. They will learn how to bring characters and stories to life, work in groups to create drama pieces, and reflect on different styles of drama from around the world.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

In Term 3, students will be covering the following topics across Sports and Physical Education:

Grades Prep-2 - Students in Prep - 2 will be showcasing their bouncing and shooting skills in basketball and will have specialist tennis coaches in their PE sessions.

Grades 3/4 – Students in grade 3/4 will be having their swimming and water safety program, have the chance to participate at hoop time and Athletics. In PE sessions, students will be focusing on tennis with a specialist coach and preparing for Hoop Time with our basketball unit.

Grades 5/6 - Students in grade 5/6 will be having their swimming and water safety program, have the chance to participate at athletics and a variety of winter and summer sports. In PE sessions, students will be focusing on tennis with a specialist coach and work on their soccer skills.


All students will have the chance to participate in the AFL Footy Roadshow and dress in their favourite team's colour.

WHATS HAPPENING IN SPECIALIST PROGRAMS DURING TERMS

CULTURAL STUDIES



This term in Cultural Studies, students are learning about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures. They will explore what "Country" means, learn about traditional seasonal calendars, and discover the significance of sacred places like Uluru and Budj Bim. Students will also listen to Dreaming stories, investigate cultural symbols, and reflect on the importance of caring for Country. We're looking forward to a thoughtful and creative term as we deepen our understanding of Australia's First Peoples.



SCIENCE

This term is all about Earth and Space Sciences! Prep students will become weather experts, while our Grade 1s will be looking at ways for us to be sustainable and to look after our planet. We are grabbing our Solar System passports in Grade 2 and investigating the space above us, while our Grade 3s are focussing on the soils, rocks and minerals beneath our feet. Grade 4 students will explore the real-world issues of extreme weather and human impact on our climate. Our Grade 5s will embark on a greater journey into space as they examine the way that gravity influences the movement of celestial objects, and finally, it will be an extreme experience for our Grade 6 students as they study the dynamic structure of the Earth and the impact on volcano formation, eruptions, earthquakes and tsunamis.



LIBRARY

This term in Library is sure to be a fun!

Book Week takes place in week 5, kicking off on Monday 18th August with our annual Book Week Dress Up Parade. During this week classrooms will be decorating their doorways and there will be competition matching teachers to their favourite books.

This year in Book Week we celebrate 80 years of the Children's Book Council of Australia acknowledging Australian authors and illustrators and boy do we have some great writers in our country.

During Library sessions all grades will be listening to many of the 2025 shortlisted books and doing a related activity.

In the second half of the term we cover topics such as families, insects, with a focus on bees, ethics and the upper grades will be looking at the Dewey decimal system.

As always, children are encouraged to borrow plenty of books during their library lessons. We have an army of people working behind the scenes cataloguing and covering the new books that are always landing in our library!

Finally...the Premiers Reading Challenge continues until 5th September. This gives you plenty of days to keep adding books to your personal profile! Happy Reading!


