PARENT CONTRIBUTIONS 2026

Last year as we endeavoured to keep the cost of schooling down as well as cut down on excess books we changed our book packs. Feedback was largely positive from parents and we have been able to undertake a stocktake of what resources we have remaining and adjust our orders accordingly.

In 2026 we will again order bulk supplies of all of the stationery requirements and they will be handed out to the students by the classroom teacher in 2026. By doing this we have been able to reduce the amount of supplies that we need to order and subsequently this has meant that we have been able to keep our school contributions at the same cost as 2024 and 2025.

2026 CLASS PLACEMENTS

As we move towards the end of the 2025 school year staff have been working on the process of creating grades for the 2026 school year. Whilst this sounds like a straightforward task, creating grades is a complex process which takes much time and effort. Every child has ensured that they

On Monday December 15, students will spend time in their 2026 classes with their new teachers and classmates.

What factors are considered when making grades?

The objective of making classes is to ensure they are as balanced as possible. Factors that teachers and principal staff consider are learning needs, behaviour, gender, learning and social networks, social and emotional maturity, class placements in previous years, opportunity for students to broaden their friendship groups and family situations (eg. twins, cousins, siblings).

Why has my child not been placed with one of their five nominated friends?

All children are placed with at least one of their five nominated friends and most likely more. While this question is often asked, when the handwritten forms of the students are checked it proves that a mistake was not made. Quite often students forget who they selected or inform their parents they have not been placed with at least one friend when in fact they have.

Why haven't my requests been approved?

All family requests are seriously considered and recorded. At times, family requests can be conflicting with another family's request, to the student's requests, or from the professional opinion of the teacher.

When I get my child's class placement, can I request that it be changed?

The class placements are considered final. Changes are not made due to the fact they cause a chain reaction and impact on the class balance. We consider the learning and wellbeing of each individual during the placement process and families must realise their child is part of a complex equation in school placements. If the school has made an obvious error, a change may be made.

How can I help my child during this process?

Families can help by supporting the informed decisions of the staff and ensuring all conversations with their children are positive and encouraging. Hold a conversation with your child and discuss who would be suitable to list as 5 possible classmates in 2026.







Grade 2


What a year it's been in Grade 2! We have certainly had a great year of learning and fun!



We THRIVED in GRADE 5!


What a fantastic year it has been in Grade 5! We have embraced every opportunity with enthusiasm, teamwork, and a positive attitude.


