PARENT CONTRIBUTIONS 2026

Today we informed the school community of the Parent Payments for 2026 via Compass. Last year as we endeavoured to keep the cost of schooling down as well as cut down on excess books we changed our book packs. Feedback was largely positive from parents and we have been able to undertake a stocktake of what resources we have remaining and adjust our orders accordingly.

In 2026 we will again order bulk supplies of all of the stationery requirements and they will be handed out to the students by the classroom teacher in 2026. By doing this we have been able to reduce the amount of supplies that we need to order and subsequently this has meant that we have been able to keep our school contributions at the same cost as 2024 and 2025.

We thank you in advance for your payments as these contributions allow us to offer a range of opportunities for our students in 2026.

CLASS STRUCTURE 2026

Planning a fair and equitable class structure for 2026 is underway. Through this process we must decide on the number of classes required at each level, so we can provide an optimal learning environment for all. In 2026 we will have 24 classes. Due to student numbers we have had to make the decision to have a Grade 5/6 Composite class. We have had composite classes at The Basin in the past and we know they work well here and like all classes students will be taught at their point of need.

There are several considerations we must make when planning our class structure which include:

- Government funding – All schools are funded for the number of students enrolled and we need to staff both classroom and specialist programs
- The number of students in each year level
- Class size and equity for all

Of course, the key factor in all schools will always be quality teaching, so whilst the grade structure is important, we know that it is not as important as the work our teachers do every day.

Melissa has over 20 years experience teaching Science across both primary and secondary schools and is excited to be part of the team here at The Basin for 2026. Additionally we welcome back Claire Saliba who has been on family leave but has been working each Wednesday through Term 4 as she prepares to return in 2026.

TIMETABLE FOR 2026

We have reviewed our daily/weekly timetable and in 2026 we will have a new timetable structure. Our specialist program subjects for 2026 will see students undertake 5 specialist subjects: Physical Education, Art, Performing Arts, Library/Auslan and Science. After consultation with the community earlier in the year Auslan was overwhelmingly selected by the school community as their preferred option for a language at The Basin. We have made the decision to run Library/Auslan as one subject so that students still have access to the library program whilst also undertaking Auslan. In 2026 the specialist sessions will be extended out to 50 minutes per week.

We are proud that we have such a broad range of specialist learning programs. This opportunity is highly valuable as it broadens the educational experience for each child. It is also an important confidence builder as it enables students to shine in an area in which they have special talents.

Our specialist programs are also complemented by lots of extra-curricular programs such as; Inter-school sport, camps, lunch time activities, extension and support programs, school productions, Wakakirri, Victorian State Schools Spectacular and so on.

Our new timetable will see the school day structured differently from how it is now. After consultation with staff and numerous other schools who have a similar timetable, we have decided that we will start the 2026 school year with the model below. We will review the timetable throughout the year to ensure that it is best meeting the various needs of students and staff and adjust if required.

Grade One Excursion - All Aboard the Puffing Billy!



As part of our Integrated Studies topic “Technology Time Machine”, our Grade One students have been exploring how technology has changed over time — especially in the way people travel. We’ve had rich discussions in the classroom about how transportation has evolved, from horses and carriages to steam trains, cars and modern electric transport. One highlight of our learning has been discovering the story of Puffing Billy, one of Victoria’s most famous and oldest steam trains.

To bring our learning to life, we went on a very special excursion to experience this piece of history for ourselves! The excitement was high as we arrived at Belgrave Station and boarded the Puffing Billy steam train. The children were fascinated to see how the train runs on steam power, watching the clouds of smoke puff into the air and hearing the whistle echo through the Dandenong Ranges.

We travelled from Belgrave to Lakeside Station in Emerald, taking in the beautiful scenery and imagining what it might have been like to travel this way long ago. At Lakeside, we enjoyed a picnic lunch together and had a wonderful time playing on the playground before returning to school by bus.

This excursion provided a fantastic link to our classroom learning. The students were able to make real-world connections to the ideas we’ve been exploring - understanding how technology and transport have changed and appreciating the engineering and history behind the famous Puffing Billy.

It was a day full of excitement, hands-on learning, and smiles all around. A big thank you to our teachers and parent helpers for making this memorable learning experience possible!

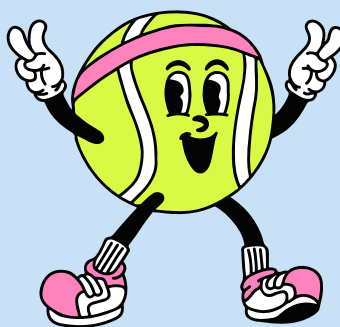
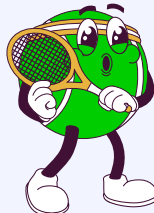


Tennis Girls A
