2026 CLASS PLACEMENT REQUESTS

We are about to start the process of making plans for teacher and student placements for 2026. This is a complex process involving a range of factors and allocations. Student and teacher placements will not be finalised until later in the school year. Each year the staff work through a comprehensive process to form classes for the new year. Current teaching teams (including specialist teachers) develop prospective lists based on their knowledge of the students in relation to their academic, social/emotional and physical needs. I wish to offer parents an opportunity to provide, in writing, any special considerations in terms of any particular educational needs their child/ren may have, in line with school policy. Please be aware that we will consider all requests **but make no guarantees** that requests will be met. **Please note that specific requests for teachers will not be considered.** Any specific requests from parents in regard to the placement of their child/ren must be in writing on the Google Doc available through the link:

<https://forms.gle/HaByg3hVTGHjQJ1T7> by no later than **Friday October 31, 2025**. It is essential to have requests in by this date to assist with planning, staffing and organisation. Late requests will not be considered.

To further assist us in our planning for the 2026 school year it is imperative that we have as accurate a figure as possible of enrolments for 2026. If you know anyone who is intending to enrol their child at The Basin but hasn't done so already, please encourage them to do so as soon as possible. If they are unsure about the process, please direct them to call the office for assistance. It is equally important to know if any families of children currently in Prep to Year 5 are leaving The Basin in 2025. Please inform the office staff as soon as possible if your child/ren will not be returning so that this can be factored into 2026 planning.



SUNSMART

As a registered member of the Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Program, our policy for wearing hats whenever outside is now in effect. Without a hat, play must be undercover to avoid the damaging UV. Our school aims to protect children and staff from too much UV to help minimise future skin cancer risk. With fire season fast approaching it is a good time to remind our families to ensure that all your details are up to date at the school. We know that a number of peoples circumstances have changed recently and we require the most up to date records to ensure we can contact you. If you have changed address, got a new phone number or changed employment could you please let the office know.

WHATS HAPPENING IN SPECIALIST PROGRAMS DURING TERM 4

CULTURAL STUDIES



Ciao! This term in Cultural Studies, students are travelling (in spirit!) to Italy. The Junior School is discovering Italy through food, music, art, landmarks, and festivals – from gondolas to gelato, there's so much to explore!

Grade 3/4 students are delving into Italian geography, traditions, and daily life, comparing it with Australia and exploring what makes each culture unique.

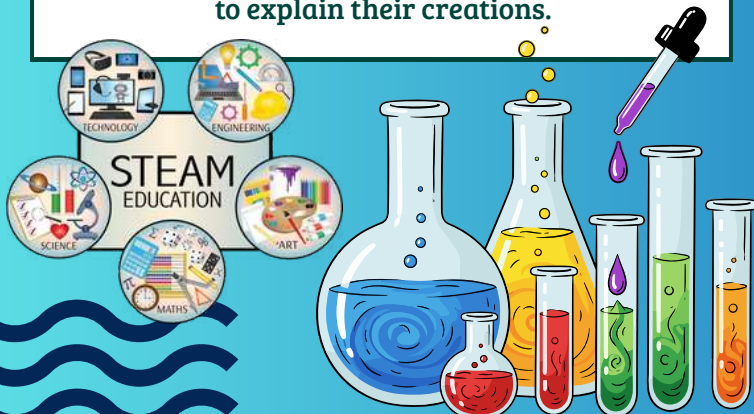
Grade 5/6 students are taking on the role of travel planners, designing their own itineraries for an Italian adventure. Together, our students will experience the sights, sounds, and tastes of Italy, making this a vibrant and memorable term of learning that we are all excited about!

SCIENCE

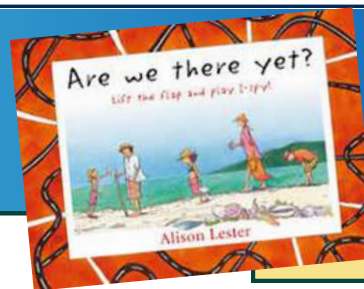
Term 4 is going to be a creative, engaging and messy term with students exploring Chemical Sciences, and for our senior students, STEAM!

Prep students will learn how to describe simple, everyday materials, while our Grade 1s will be looking at the different ways we can change objects. We are getting messy and making mixtures in Grade 2, while our Grade 3s are focussing on important details during 'Spy School'. Grade 4 students will explore the use and purpose of various objects based on the materials they are made from.

Our Grade 5s will develop their Science Inquiry Skills as they engage with the various components of the STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics) project. Likewise, our Grade 6s start with some explosive chemistry and then will fully immerse themselves in the STEAM Project by researching, planning, designing and building a prototype model with supporting resources including a written description, artist's impressions, blueprints, ICT component and poster to explain their creations.



LIBRARY



Term 4 in the Library will once again be full of fun. The term starts with the Scholastic Book Fair, where students will have the chance to expand their home library and purchase books.

Preps will be looking at different authors throughout the term, with some favourites such as Margaret Wild, Alison Lester, Bob Graham and Mem Fox.

The grade 1/2s will also be doing some author studies and will be looking at oceans and the animals within as we look at some non-fiction texts.

Grade 3/4s will be learning how to use the Dewey Decimal system to locate non-fiction books and will have a focus on bees.

In Grade 5/6, students will also be looking at the Dewey Decimal system and non-fiction texts and they will also be working towards writing their own picture story book.

And of course, each week the students will have the chance to borrow books. We are always adding to the collection and over the holidays we got some great new titles in.

WHATS HAPPENING IN SPECIALIST PROGRAMS DURING TERM 3

ART

Term four in the Art Room is shaping up to be a colourful and creative celebration! We'll begin by working together on some exciting collaborative pieces, as well as putting the finishing touches on projects from Term 3 in preparation for our Art Show in Week 4. The students are buzzing with excitement as they get ready to showcase a vibrant mix of paintings, ceramics, drawings, collage, textiles, and models – a true reflection of their hard work and imagination. The Art Show will be a wonderful opportunity for families to see the incredible talents of our budding artists on display. Once the show is complete, we'll finish the year with a range of fun, skills-based activities designed to let students' experiment, be expressive, and explore their creativity while linking with their classroom learning. It's going to be a busy, joyful, and inspiring Term 4 in the Art Room!



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

In Term 4, students will be digging into volleyball as a part of our net/wall games, setting themselves up for the very popular gymnastics programs and serving their class members some line and length bowling in the upcoming cricket units.

Throughout these programs students will learn to catch at high and low heights, build their balance, strength and coordination and use taught skills by implementing these into a variety of sporting opportunities.

I can't wait to see our 5/6 summer sport teams get the opportunity to compete in their gala days and all of the basketball teams progressing in the SSV and Hoop Time pathway.

Prep - 2's will be participating in a 10 day swim program in which I can't wait to see the growth in each students abilities, confidence and water awareness.

The 2025 **Premiers Reading Challenge** finished on September 5th and we would like to send a HUGE congratulations to all participants.

This year we had **265 students** complete the challenge! Amazing!

In total **12,917 books** were read -
Unbelievable!!!!

This means that on average each participant read 48 books. However, upon scouring the stats it was discovered that we had one Preppie read 78 books - WOW! Infact several Preppies read over 70 books. We also discovered some students had read well over 100 books and for our senior students it was fantastic to see some of them reading 60-70 books – a huge effort considering many of their books are quite lengthy.

This is a huge achievement! It is wonderful to see so many kids enjoying reading.

On Monday the 22nd of September Mum, Mack and I left home in The Basin to start our 8 and a half hour drive to the Sydney Equestrian Center. We stopped at Gundagai on the way. We did the whole drive in two days, towing Mack behind us in his float! It was a lot of driving..

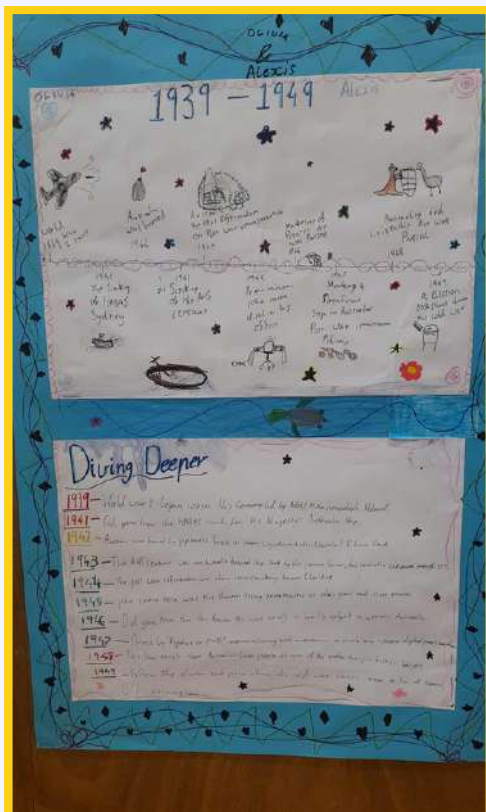
Once we got there I rode Mack to help him relax, stretch his legs and see the arenas. Then my coach came so I had to ride again. On Thursday I did the dressage for the combined training 65cm Primary Event. During the test we had a visitor... a brown snake! That was 'fun'. Everyone freaked out (as you can imagine!). The next day (Friday) I participated in the Show Jumping event. It was a very easy, which helped me get a great result, just out of the placings! On Sunday we had the Dressage Event which was the first test. It went well and the second test was also positive.

Overall, I came eight in the dressage and seventh in the combined training events (show jumping and dressage). That's 7th and 8th the whole of Australia for the Primary School 65cm and Preliminary Dressage category. I'm very proud of myself and Mack. Thanks also to my coach, the school and my mum for all the support everyone has provided!



GRADE 4 ERA'S EXPO

With much excitement the Grade 4's presented their projects on 'Australia's Journey' together in the stadium on Wednesday 17th September. Their posters were researched in an era (10 years) focussing on the changes in laws, rules, technology, music, fashion and interesting points (crimes, money, sporting results). Students spoke about their learnings and responded to questions from visitors. It was a great afternoon showing all our work and understandings of the way Australia has changed.





COMMUNITY HELPERS VISIT OUR SCHOOL

During the last week of Term 3, our students had a very special visit from some important community helpers – the police, the fire brigade, and a nurse. Each group shared how they help to keep our community safe and healthy, and the children loved learning more about their roles.

The firefighters showed students the protective clothing and equipment they use when responding to emergencies. The children were fascinated by the tools and enjoyed learning about how firefighters work to keep people safe.

The police officers spoke about the different ways they support the community. Students had the chance to look inside a police car and police wagon, which was a real highlight. They listened carefully as the officers explained how police help in everyday situations.

The nurse also brought along some special medical equipment. The children enjoyed practising bandaging and using stethoscopes while learning how nurses care for people when they are sick or injured.

It was a wonderful experience that gave students a deeper understanding of the important roles these helpers play in our lives. We thank our visitors for taking the time to share their knowledge and inspire our young learners!
